Against all odds...

"The miracle on 106th and Park" and "the best kept secret in New York City" are just some of the phrases that tell the story of Cristo Rey New York High School. Cristo Rey is a model of persistence. No matter what the obstacles are, our students show their resilience as they achieve their goals in extraordinary numbers.

With so much uncertainty over the last three years from the pandemic and its aftermath, one constant has been the success of Cristo Rey and its students. Every single one of our graduates since 2020 has been accepted into a four-year college or university. But the success doesn't stop once they graduate high school. Since the school's founding, 77% of our alumni either have graduated from college or are on track to graduate — a college success rate five times the national average for students from similar economic backgrounds.

The success of Cristo Rey's most recent alumni in college proves that our mission and vision change the lives of the students who walk our halls. The 2023-2024 school year marks Cristo Rey's 20th year in East Harlem, but our success was hardly a certainty when we first opened our doors in the fall of 2004. Today, with more than 1,200 graduates and countless success stories, Cristo Rey continues to show that "The School That Works" truly lives up to its motto.

Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP)

The School That Works

Learning in "The School That Works" is the foundation of the Cristo Rev student experience. Our Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP) began as a unique way to fund our school and grew to redefine who could have access to a quality prepschool education. Motivated student-workers learn to navigate the workplace as they perform entry-level responsibilities. Students' earnings from CWSP cover a significant part of the cost of their education.

For the Cristo Rev students, work-based learning generates new skills, new networks, and new imaginings of what is possible. They are aware of

professions such as health care, banking, and law, but these careers are often not deeply understood and, for many, seem out of reach. Their participation in CWSP over four years of high school makes these professions start to feel tangible, and possibly attainable. A CRNYHSbased corps of teachers and counselors works hand in hand with our CWSP partners and mentors to help ensure that our students are academically. emotionally, and financially prepared to chart a life path that excites them. It's this whole package that creates a stable and more equitable foundation for student success in college and career. And it works.

Building Back

The 2022-2023 school year was a time of building back CSWP partnerships to ensure that every CRNYHS student had a work placement. At the start of the school year, iust under 70% of students had a work placement, a tremendous increase from the prior year coming out of the pandemic. However, the reality of post-pandemic workplace transitions continued to make traditional corporate placements scarcer than in pre-pandemic times. Fortunately, community organizations, hospitals, and local elementary schools eagerly took in students as program assistants, patient ambassadors, data entry


assistants, teachers' aides, and many other roles. Additionally, our entire school community of trustees, teachers, staff, and volunteers worked to find quality work placement opportunities.

By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, over 95% of students were in work placements, with 60% in paid placements and 40% working in unpaid

placements with nonprofit community partners. These nonprofit placements. while demanding of our students in the best ways, require third-party funding to be economically sustainable. With our school's firm commitment to keep family financial contributions within their reach, the school relies on CWSP partners to cover 40% of the \$22,000 cost to educate a student at

Cristo Rey. Thanks to several generous sponsors, the school was able to cover part of the revenue gap created by unpaid placements. The school continues to seek additional paid corporate placements and innovative ways to partner, recognizing that the shift to a hybrid environment in New York City's work landscape is likely to be permanent.

CWSP Student Worker Placements by School Year



With 95% of our students placed at a work study job, nearly half are placed at nonprofit community partners. Due to this, we rely on contributions from third-party supporters to help supplement the revenue that we would otherwise receive at a paid placement.

When Nigel Agyarko began high school, classes were remote. His sophomore year, he wore a mask. "It was one for the books," he said. Through CWSP, Nigel has worked for Capital Group since his freshman year. That, too, began remotely.

Nigel admits that working remotely was tedious and boring at times. He was one of a select group of students who worked remotely, something Cristo Rey had not attempted in the past, so he felt a bit of added pressure to perform well. Fast forward to today, and Nigel is deeply thankful for the experience.

"If it wasn't for Capital Group, I would have no idea what I want my life to look like moving forward," he said. Nigel credits the CWSP staff for preparing him to handle the work environment. "Learning office skills and mannerisms has helped me navigate my way through the Capital Group network, which includes many influential people. I appreciate all that I am learning from them." he said.

As Nigel prepares for graduation in June 2024, he often finds perspective from the Rudyard Kipling poem "If—" in which Kipling wrote: "If you can meet with Triumph and Disaster / And treat those two impostors just the same" (12-13).




FY2023 Financials
